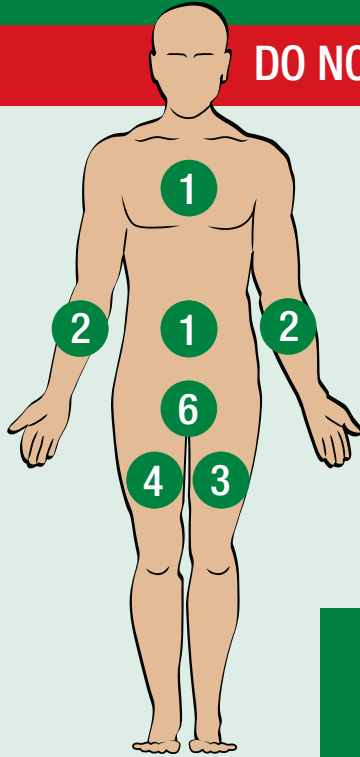


Daily CHG Treatment Bath

Chlorhexidine (CHG) is a strong antiseptic used to kill germs. Patients receive a CHG treatment “bath” in the hospital daily to help prevent infections.

Use a new wipe for each of the six areas below.

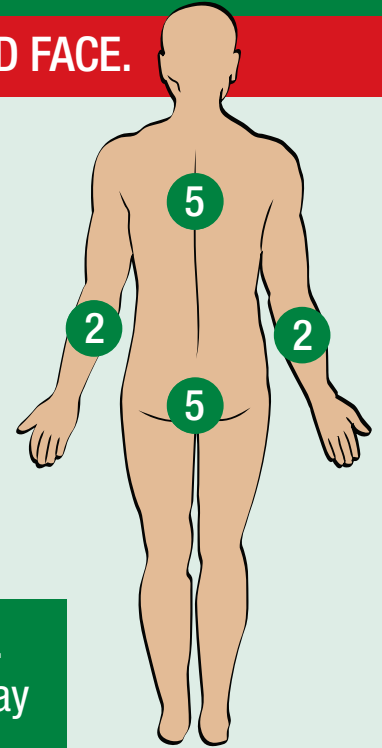
DO NOT USE CHG WIPES ON YOUR HEAD AND FACE.



Front

- 1 Neck, shoulders, chest and abdomen
- 2 Both arms and hands
- 3 Left leg and foot
- 4 Right leg and foot
- 5 Back of neck, back and buttocks
- 6 Groin

Skin may feel sticky for a few minutes.
Do NOT wipe off. This feeling will go away
after a few minutes of air drying.

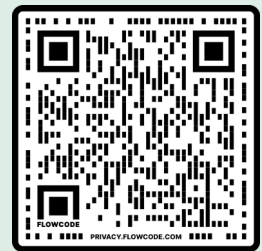


Back

DO NOT FLUSH CHG wipes in toilet. Dispose of them in trash.

- CHG treatment baths should be given every day.
- CHG wipes are not an antibiotic, but help kill bacteria that could make you sick while you're in the hospital.
- Do not rinse after applying. Allow skin to dry before dressing.
- CHG wipes are safe to use on the genital area.
- Avoid the use of lotions or soaps from home. These products may prevent the wipes from working correctly. CHG-compatible lotion is available – ask your nurse if you need it.
- Staff will help you with any hard-to-reach areas and with any lines or tubes you have.
