

VOLUNTEER AUXILIARY NURSING SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Volunteer Auxiliary Nursing Scholarships

Lexington Medical Center Volunteer Auxiliary is accepting applications for nursing scholarships at a variety of levels.

How to Apply

Applications are available online, at the Lexington Medical Center volunteer office, high school guidance offices, and through health occupation teachers.

Deadline

Applications are due by **March 14, 2022 at 4:00 pm.** (Incomplete applications will be discarded.)

Requirements and Who Should Apply -

Ann Wingate Scholarship - \$1,000.00

Awarded to high school seniors who reside in Lexington County or attend a Lexington County School*, or a student with a GED certificate, who is planning to earn an Associate Degree in Nursing. *Home School, Charter School, Private School, Virtual School Seniors who reside in Lexington County may apply.

- Letter of acceptance into nursing (Pre Nursing Program meets requirement)
- Student has been accepted into an Associate Degree Program in Nursing
- High school transcript with GPA, class rank, and SAT or ACT scores
- Two letters of Recommendation (not a relative)
- Essay of approximately 200 words stating why I chose nursing as a profession
- Application must be complete

Medhurst/Norton/Telfer Scholarship - \$2,000.00

Awarded to high school seniors who reside in Lexington County or attend a Lexington County School, or a student with a GED certificate who is planning to earn a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing.

- Letter of acceptance to a college or university
- Student has been accepted into a Nursing Baccalaureate Degree Program
- For freshmen, acceptance into a Pre Nursing Program meets requirement
- High School Transcript with GPA, class rank, and SAT or ACT scores
- Two letters of Recommendation (not a relative)
- Essay of approximately 200 words stating why I chose nursing as a profession
- Application must be complete

Sandra Dodd Continuing Education Scholarship - \$1,000.00

Awarded to students pursuing Baccalaureate Degrees in Nursing.

- Prior scholarship recipients are encouraged to apply
- Student has been accepted into a Nursing Baccalaureate Degree Program
- College student with a sophomore or higher standing, who has gained or will gain, full acceptance into a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing Program
- Letter of endorsement from the Dean or other Official of the Nursing Program is required
- One additional letter of recommendation (not a relative)
- College transcript with GPA
- Essay of approximately 200 words stating what nursing means to me
- Application must be complete

Cook/Price Mature Student Scholarship - \$1,000.00

Awarded to mature nursing students in a two-year (2) or four-year (4) program

- Acceptance to an Associate or Baccalaureate or Pre Nursing Program
- A letter of acceptance is required
- Two letters of recommendation (not a relative)
- Transcript of prior academic work with GPA, if available
- Essay of approximately 200 words stating what nursing means to me
- Application must be complete

Auxiliary Volunteers Memorial Scholarship - \$3,000.00

- One scholarship will be awarded each year. No separate applications needed. The Scholarship Committee will select a student showing superior academic ability from the applications received.

Important Information about Applying -

Incomplete or Late Applications

- Incomplete applications will be discarded
- Late applications cannot be considered for scholarships

Criteria for Scholarships

- Students planning to pursue a nursing degree may apply.
- Preference will be given to prior scholarship winners for the Sandra Dodd Continuing Education Scholarship and employees of Lexington Medical Center for the Cook/Price Mature Student Scholarship.
- For freshmen attending schools that do not accept students for full admission to the Nursing Program until their junior year, acceptance to the Pre-Nursing Program will meet the requirement.
