#### **Founders Family Night**


Event takes place in the Summer.

Wine on the River was founded by **Women of Hope**, the Foundation's volunteerism and networking group.



Program	Description
Cancer Transitions Program	Provides support programs to help cancer survivors transition from active treatment to post-treatment care
Exercise is Medicine	Provides specialized training for individuals with cancer, chronic disease and diabetes, among other conditions
HOPE Teddy Bears	Provided to every newly diagnosed breast cancer patient since 1998 for seat belt comfort and encouragement
Lymphedema Supply Fund	Provides compression wraps to uninsured and underinsured lymphedema patients
Supportive Care Items	Provides patients who have had a mastectomy with a post-surgical bra, supplies and cosmetic bag

Our Mother/Baby programs help ensure the highest quality health services and resources are available to new mothers and their babies.


## Mamava® Lactation Pods

Lexington Medical Center is the first hospital in South Carolina to install two Mamava lactation pods inside the hospital. The pods, funded by the Foundation, provide a private, comfortable and convenient space for visitors and employees to breastfeed their babies or pump breast milk.

Lexington Medical Center nurse, Deborah Belton, RN, BSN, PCCN, used the pods daily following the birth of her youngest daughter Ariella. The lactation pods provided her with a private space to pump so her daughter could receive the best nutrition possible.

"While serving as a Clinical Coordinator at Lexington Medical Center, I delivered my second daughter. Breastfeeding was important to me, and the Mamava lactation pod, funded by the Foundation, provided me with a safe, private and quiet space to pump breast milk without inconveniencing anyone. Using the pod twice daily while at work, I was provided a space for relaxation: the fan calmed me, and the dimmed lighting allowed me to slip away for a great pumping session."

Program	Description
Car Seat Injury Prevention Initiative	Provides car seats and education for the safe transport of babies and children
Doula Services	Supports the training and certification of current and future doulas to ensure the availability of this free resource to patients
Helping Pregnant Mothers	Provides newborn care education to expectant mothers with financial strain
Infant CPR Kits	Provides cardiopulmonary resuscitation kits to families, allowing them to learn lifesaving procedures before taking their Special Care Nursery infants home
Kisses <sup>™</sup> for Hugs <sup>®</sup> Infant Protection System	Provides Kisses <sup>™</sup> system, creating an immediate electronic link between mother and baby at the time of birth
Newborn Baby Supplies/ Special Care Nursery Care Packages	Provides care packages to parents with newborns in the Special Care Nursery for extra support
Perinatal Loss Program	Funds the clinical and educational needs of Labor and Delivery staff
Postpartum Blood Pressure Initiative	Provides blood pressure cuffs to patients to monitor postpartum hypertensive disorders to prevent cardiac events
Safe Sleep for Newborns	Provides newborn infants with a comfortable HALO® SleepSack® swaddle, which reduces the risk of suffocation and/or entrapment

# **Smoking Cessation Program**

After smoking for more than 50 years, Paul was a self-proclaimed "smoker for life" before attending the smoking cessation program provided by the Foundation. This program was offered following a cardiac health event as part of his rehabilitation plan and marked his first serious attempt to quit.

"The program provided me structure, support, and a range of suggested methods to help me become smoke-free. The process to quit is individualized, and this program allows various approaches, letting participants choose what works best for them. I entered the program in July 2021 and quit smoking August 4. I could have never quit without this program and its dedicated staff. Ultimately, it provided me with a few more days, weeks, months — or hopefully years — on this earth both for me and those I care about. I commend the program and the donors who make it possible."

## **Cardiac Care Grants**

Programs to help heart patients achieve full recovery

Program	Description
COPD Tool Kit	Provides supplies to chronic obstructive pulmonary disease patients during their hospital stay to facilitate the transition home
CVICU Heart Pillows	Provides comfort pillows to patients recovering from open heart surgery and other procedures in the Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit
E-cigarette and Vaping Cessation Teen Education Program	Provides educational materials to inform teens regarding the risks of e-cigarette use
Freedom From Smoking™	Provides smoking cessation program for the community (eight-week program offered four times per year)
Harmonicas for Health™	Provides a harmonica to patients who suffer from shortness of breath to help strengthen the muscles used for breathing
Home Blood Pressure Monitoring	Provides the tools needed for at-home blood pressure monitoring for patients with hypertension
Scales for Heart Failure Patients	Provides scales to heart failure patients upon admission to help reinforce education, regardless of financial need
Tobacco Cessation Program	Provides resource kits for patients who actively smoke and show interest in quitting during urgent care or primary care visits

Baby Doll Therapy	Uses baby dolls and stuffed animals to comfort patients who may suffer from varying stages of dementia or Alzheimer's disease
Bariatric Surgery Tool Kit	Provides the necessary tools to be successful after receiving bariatric surgery
Blood Sugar Testing Supplies	Provides educational and motivational materials to newly diagnosed or uncontrolled diabetic patients to help them become more comfortable with monitoring their blood sugar at home

Clothing for Emergency Department Patients	Provides clothing for patients who do not have appropriate attire for discharge

Decreasing Delirium	Provides visual stimulation through dynamic aquarium scenes on all in-house televisions
Diabetes Education	Disperses educational and motivational materials focused on diabetes to underserved rural populations
Diabetic Supplies	Provides supplies to newly diagnosed diabetes patients at Lexington Medical Center's main hospital, as well as at physician practices in Batesburg–Leesville and Swansea
Emergency Department Hospitality Cart	Provides essentials for patients during emergency visits
Exercise is Medicine	Provides specialized training for individuals with cancer, chronic disease and diabetes, among other conditions
Eyeglass Cases	Provides padded eyeglass cases for surgical patients
HealthStream® MyClinicalExchange Platform	Schedules and onboards nursing students electronically
Heart Bears	Provides a teddy bear to family members that includes the patient's heartbeat recorded by Doppler
Hospital-to-Home	Provides non-medical in-home care to high-risk patients who have been discharged from the hospital
Lexington Medical Center Swansea Diabetes Education	Provides comprehensive health management tools to diabetic patients at Lexington Medical Center Swansea Primary Care
Lymphedema Supply Fund	Provides uninsured and underinsured lymphedema patients with compression wraps
Medical Intensive Care Unit Keepsake Hands	Provides 3D hand-casting kits for families who experience unexpected loss in the Medical Intensive Care Unit
Non-surgical Weight Management	Provides comprehensive weight management education and practical tools for participants
Ostomy Support	Provides dignity and support to newly diagnosed ostomy patients, with an ostomy bag cover given to class attendees
Project Prescription and Project Transportation	Provides assistance with medication and transportation for patients who are uninsured or underinsured within the Lexington Medical Center network
Resident Hospitality Cart	Offers small items to assist residents with daily activities at Lexington Medical Center Extended Care and Carroll Campbell Place
Stop the Bleed® Classes	Provides training for Lexington Medical Center staff and volunteers, with a tourniquet given to class attendees
Teddy Bears	Provides teddy bears to comfort and encourage patients
Total Joint Program Tote Bag	Supplies tote bags to patients who attend the Total Joint Replacement Class
